NCUT's Programs to Improve Access to Basic Services for All

NCUT is deeply committed to advancing educational equity, community empowerment, and inclusive access to essential services. The university proactively organizes training and community-oriented programs to improve access to education, health, employment, and sustainability-related **services**, ensuring that underprivileged groups—especially students and local residents—benefit from tangible support and resources.

1. Collaboration with New Taipei City: A Model for Vocational Education

Through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the New Taipei City Government, NCUT has launched a seven-year initiative integrating 26 technical high schools with 12 universities of science and technology across Taiwan. This collaboration enhances access to higher education and employment opportunities through:

- **Comprehensive health examinations and mock interviews** to prepare students physically and psychologically for industry careers.
- **University preparatory courses** that bridge high school and tertiary education, ensuring smooth transitions.
- **Vocational and technical camps** offering hands-on experience with real industrial equipment.
- **Industrial resource sharing**, enabling students from rural or disadvantaged backgrounds to access university facilities and technology.
- **Teacher collaboration** programs that enhance teaching quality and align education with industry demands.

This partnership strengthens access to education and employability, especially for low-income and rural students who face barriers in pursuing technical and higher education

2. Career and Skills Development: The 2025 NCUT Job Fair

NCUT's Campus Career Fair (April 2025) hosted 90 top companies and provided 2,673 job vacancies, creating a direct link between education and employment. The event featured:

- Career counseling and soft skills training, helping students navigate workplace stress and job applications.



- Participation by the Taichung City Employment Services Office, offering incentives such as the Youth Employment Fund to improve job access for graduates.
This initiative bridges the gap between academia and employment, especially for first-generation college students from underprivileged backgrounds.

3. International Internship and Global Empowerment

NCUT's International Internship Program expands access to professional experience for all students, including those from economically challenged backgrounds.

Key highlights:

- Over 35 students have participated since 2020 in Japan, Switzerland, Canada, Australia, Malaysia, and Thailand.
- Interns receive financial and academic support, gaining exposure to global industries and diverse work cultures.
This program enhances employability and ensures that students from all income groups have access to global learning experiences without financial constraints.

4. Inclusive Learning Assistance and Community Outreach

NCUT's commitment to social inclusion extends through multiple assistance programs that ensure equitable access to education and community engagement:

- **Indigenous Student Assistance Programs:** Offer mentorship, cultural exchange, and academic guidance.
- **Mentorship for International Students:** Provide housing and adjustment support, ensuring a safe transition to Taiwanese life.
- **Digital Learning Pals Program:** University students tutor children in rural and remote areas, bridging the digital learning divide through online platforms.
- **Pre-employment and skill-bridging courses:** 36-hour training sessions designed to improve employability and confidence.

5. Financial and Institutional Support for Access

NCUT upholds equal opportunity policies ensuring that no student is left behind due to economic hardship:

- **Tuition and fee waivers** for low-income, indigenous, or disabled students.
- **The Dreamer Project**, which connects disadvantaged students with corporate mentors who fund learning projects and competitions.
- **Financial aid programs** such as the **MOOCs Learning Reward** and **Maker Reward** subsidize skills-based education and professional certification.

6. Impact on the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)

NCUT's access-oriented programs contribute directly to multiple SDGs:

- **SDG 1 – No Poverty:** By reducing educational costs and providing scholarships.
- **SDG 4 – Quality Education:** Through preparatory, digital, and skill-bridging programs for underprivileged learners.
- **SDG 8 – Decent Work and Economic Growth:** By creating pathways from education to employment.
- **SDG 10 – Reduced Inequalities:** Through community engagement, mentorship, and support for indigenous and international students.

NCUT's integrated education and community engagement model ensures **inclusive access to basic services**—education, health, employment, and technology—for all. By combining government collaboration, financial support, and community-driven innovation, NCUT continues to fulfill its role as a **national leader in social responsibility and sustainable development**.

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NCUT LAUNCHES “THIRD AGE UNIVERSITY” PROGRAM TO CREATE NEW LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE MIDLIFE GENERATION



The Ministry of Education has introduced the “Third Age University Pilot Program” this year, encouraging individuals aged 55 and above to pursue lifelong learning, foster self-growth, and continue contributing to society. National Chin-Yi University of Technology (NCUT) is participating for the first time, with the Department of Health Industry Technology and Management and the Department of Business Administration jointly enrolling students to provide a cross-disciplinary learning platform.

The Health Industry Department has launched the “Active Aging Program in Exercise and Health Management,” covering elderly care, exercise guidance, nutrition, and health management. This program equips learners with practical skills applicable in community health promotion, institutional services, and personal health management, while also opening opportunities for career transition, employment, or entrepreneurship.

NCUT Partners with Taichung Municipal Wufeng Agricultural & Industrial High School to Promote Special Class Enrollment



NCUT has established a partnership with Taichung Municipal Wufeng Agricultural & Industrial High School to enhance enrollment in special classes. A delegation from NCUT, including You, Sh-Yang, Director of the Admissions Affairs Office, Chin-Hsien Hsu, Vice Dean of the College of Management, Ching-Hsin Wang, Director of the Department of Healthcare Industry Technology Development and Management, Yu-Hsiang Chung, Assistant Professor of the Department of Industrial Management, and Group Leader Chao Jun-Song, recently visited the school and met with Principal Liao, Ben-Ting.

During the meeting, both institutions reached a consensus on special class enrollment and discussed strategies to strengthen their collaboration. This partnership aims to foster academic exchanges and talent development, laying a solid foundation for future cooperation and expansion into additional fields.





2025 NCUT Job Fair Concludes Successfully

NCUT successfully hosted the 2025 Campus Career Fair on Wednesday, April 23, drawing participation from 90 renowned companies and offering a total of 2,673 job openings across diverse industries, including precision machinery, electronics, optoelectronics, manufacturing, and services.

The fair featured full-time, internship, and part-time opportunities, alongside company briefings and career seminars. Topics ranged from workplace stress management and soft skills training to national examination preparation, helping students better understand career paths and prepare for future employment.

Students actively engaged with employers through on-site resume submissions, preliminary interviews, and one-on-one career counseling, creating a lively and productive atmosphere. In addition, the Taichung City Employment Services Office was present to promote programs like the Youth Employment Incentive Fund, encouraging graduates to actively pursue job opportunities.

NCUT continues to strengthen industry-academia collaboration, enabling students to connect with the workforce early, stay informed of industry trends, and build a solid foundation for successful careers.



SHUANGXI HIGH SCHOOL AND UNIVERSITY DIGITAL LEARNING PARTNERS MEET IN PERSON



The junior high division of Shuangxi High School in New Taipei City partnered with our university to participate in the Ministry of Education's "Digital Learning Partner Program," providing one-on-one online mentoring to students in remote areas.

A recent in-person gathering was held in Taichung, where a student named Chen shared that diverse home economics classes taught them practical skills, and their university partner helped them improve English proficiency with patience.

Teacher Chang Jing-Zhi from Shuangxi High School highlighted that online interactions foster strong learning relationships, benefiting both students and teachers by providing a sense of fulfillment and accomplishment.





Four-Year Industry-Academia Cooperation Bachelor's Program Joint Recruitment Promotion



The Overseas Community Affairs Council's joint recruitment promotion team for the 2025 Four-Year Industry-Academia Cooperation Bachelor's Program held an education fair in Singkawang and Pontianak, Indonesia, attracting 600 attendees.

Fifteen universities, including ours, participated.

Li Shu-Ling, Head of the Education Division at the Taipei Economic and Trade Office in Indonesia, noted that one-third of Indonesian students in Taiwan come from West Kalimantan, where Singkawang has a 62% Hakka population and is a hub for Mandarin education.

She encouraged students and parents to take advantage of the event to consult with university representatives and explore higher education opportunities in Taiwan.



Learning Replaces Part-Time Work to Help Students Pursue Dreams - Joint Program at Our School



Since 2018, the Ministry of Education has promoted the "Learning Replaces Part-Time Work" initiative, investing over NT\$6.8 billion to assist nearly 1.3 million students. Through various support mechanisms, including scholarships and academic counseling, students are encouraged to focus on learning and pursuing their dreams. Wang Jiahui, a student from our school, shared how the program allowed her to participate in hackathon competitions, enriching her college experience. The Ministry calls on society to continue supporting this program to benefit more students in the future.
